### Comprehension

This prayer has different words for winter and summer after the first line. Why do you think there are different words for different seasons? What is different about these seasons? What if you lived in Israel?

This prayer is about God's power. There are a number of examples of ways God shows God's power. In the English, circle at least 5 of these actions that God does to show God's power. Have you ever seen an example of one of those actions in the real world?

Why do you think it is important to bless God's power?

## Vocabulary

The word חַיִּים means life. Find the 5 words in Hebrew that have the root חַיִּים in the prayer above and circle them (they have more letters than just חַיִּים).

Why do you think a prayer about God's power is so focused on life?

Other versions of this prayer say מְחַיֵּה מֵתִים (who revives the dead) instead of מְחַיֵּה הַכֹּל (who gives life to all). Do you think that makes a big difference in the meaning of this prayer? To which version of the prayer do you feel more connected? Why?

גִּבּוֹר means 'hero.' What does God do that makes God like a hero? Who is a hero in your life? What does that person do that is heroic?
